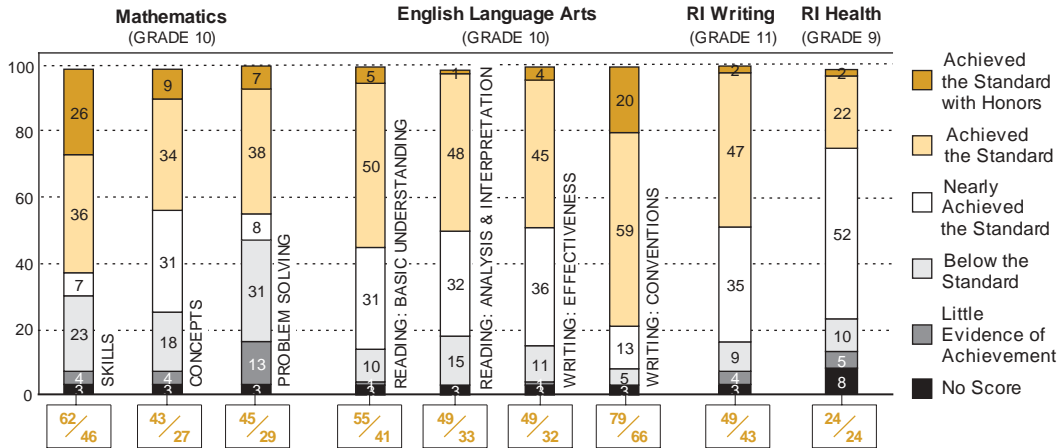

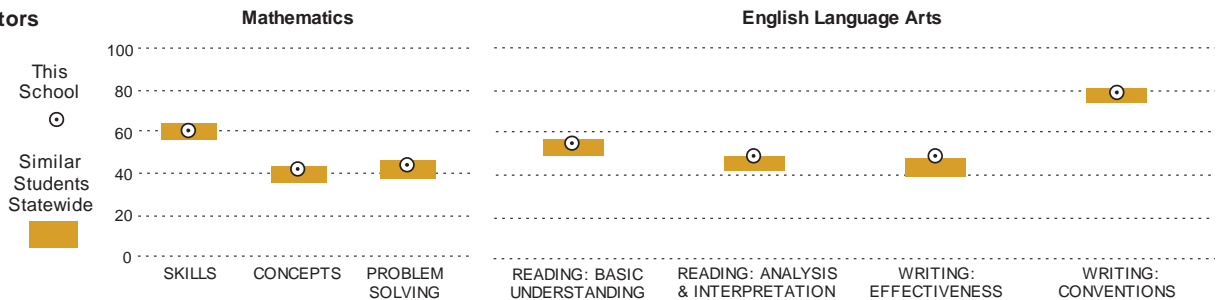

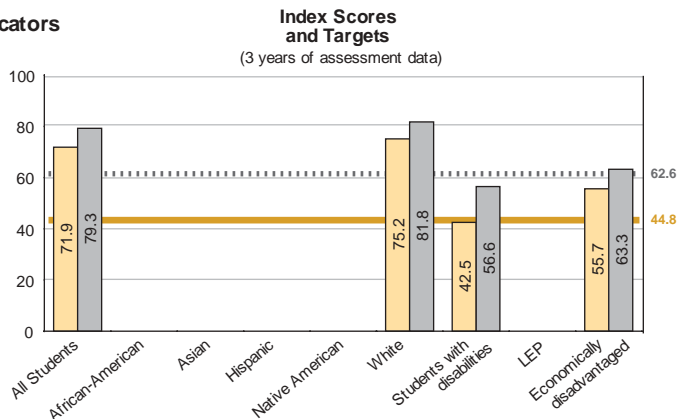
## 2003 Value-Added Indicators

Percentage of students who met or exceeded the standard compared with the percentage of similar students statewide



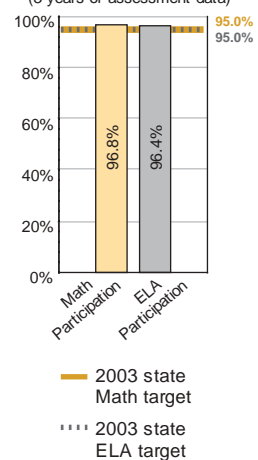

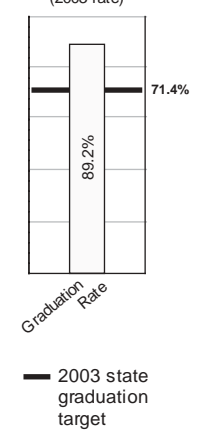

## Participation Rates and Targets



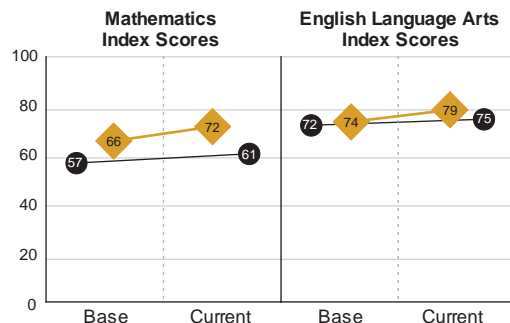
## Graduation Rate and Target

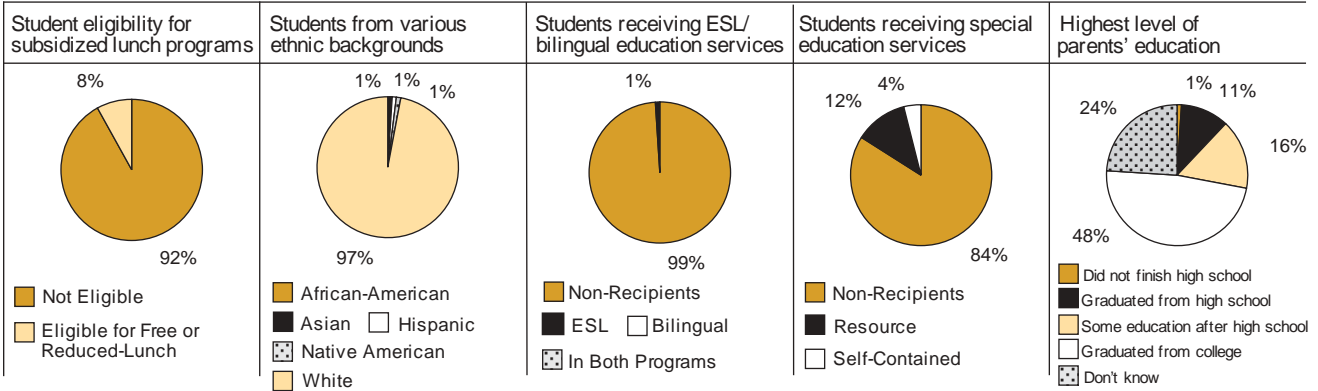

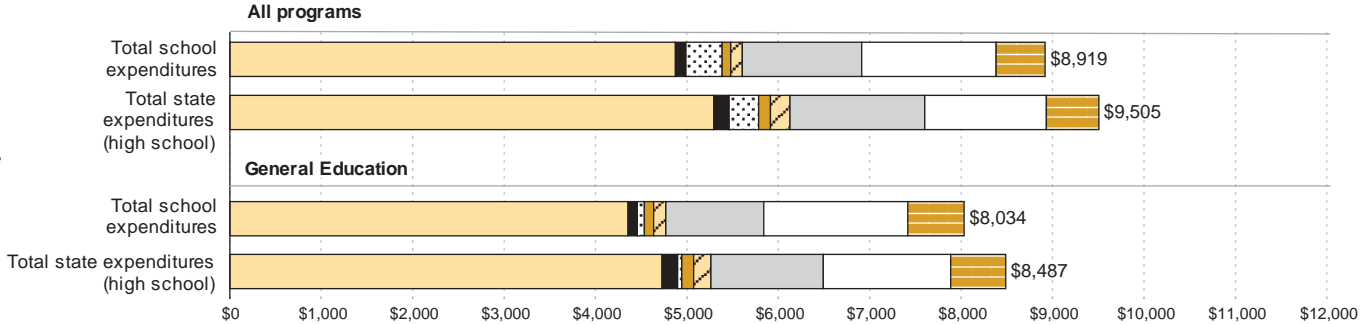

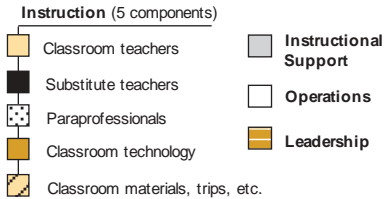

**Key for school expenditures areas**

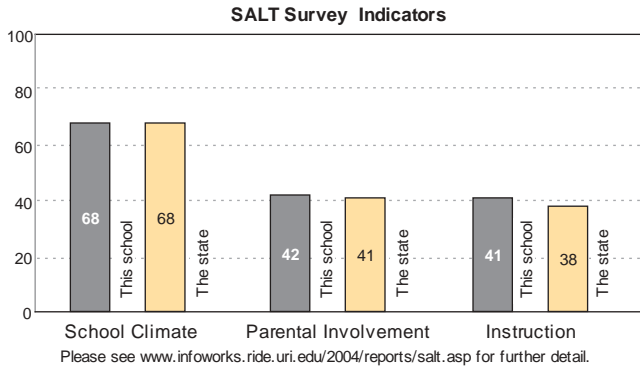


**Per pupil expenditures by program**

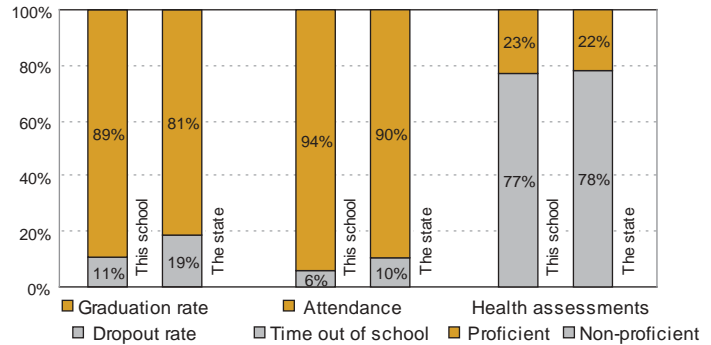

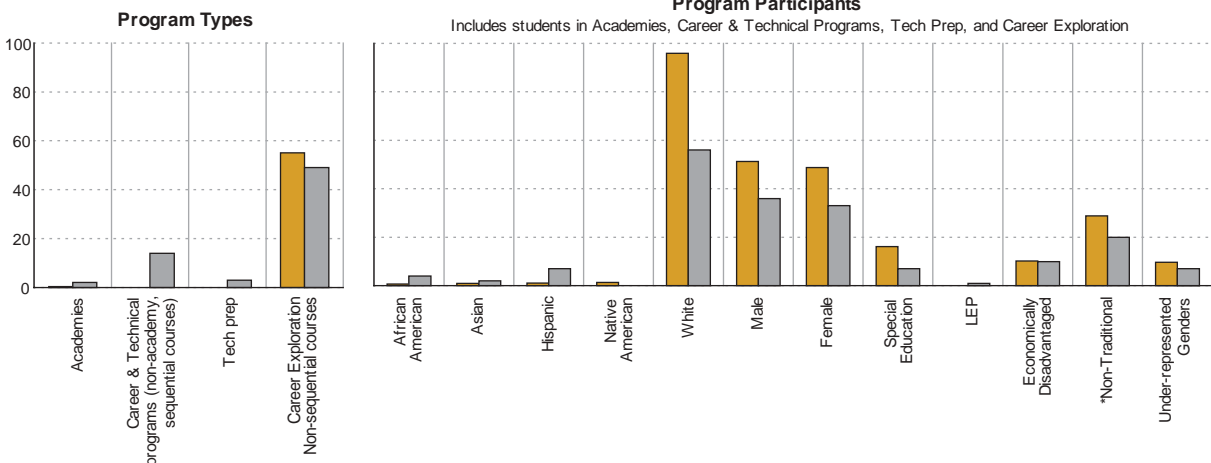

**Participation of all students in School-to-Career Education**

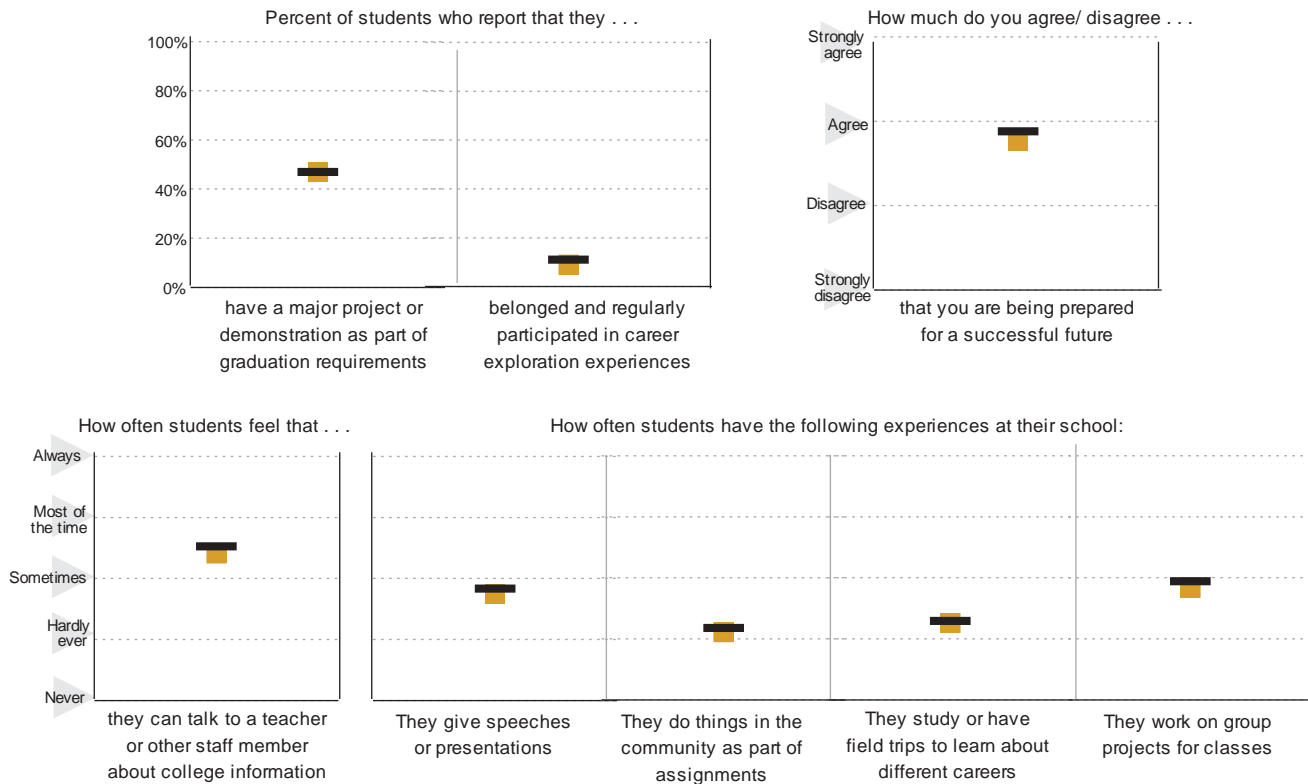
